

# Oxley Community Plan 2015

## Oxley Community Vision

Oxley endeavours to build a strong and healthy local community, rich in social and cultural opportunities and supported by appropriate infrastructure and services to satisfy the needs of a growing community.

## Profile

Oxley is a thriving little semi-rural community situated alongside the King River, on the Snow Road, 13.2km SE of Wangaratta and 253km NE of Melbourne. The surrounding district remains a grazing and dairy-farming area. Vineyards, wineries and gourmet food producers have also become an important part of the landscape. Oxley is part of the renowned Milawa Gourmet Region and is one of the first rural towns outside the Wangaratta CBD that leads to the King and Alpine Valleys. The diverse community of 275 residents is represented by the Oxley Residents' Association. The Oxley Shire Hall (1875) is an iconic building in the district, restored and valued by the locals. The Oxley Recreation Reserve with its River Red Gums and old deciduous trees provide a welcome shady retreat for picnickers and horse riders.

## Background

An initial Oxley Community Planning Meeting was held on 29 May 2009 at the Oxley Shire Hall which generated 64 themes/ideas for the Community Plan. A survey was distributed to all residents' in July 2011, asking them to prioritise these 64 themes, with results collated and displayed in October 2011. The list of prioritised themes resulting from the collation of the surveys has formed the basis for the Oxley Community Plan and is included in this document.

The Oxley Community Plan was finalised and adopted in 2012.

The current development and revision of the Oxley Community Planning is being driven by the Oxley Residents' Association.

## Ranked priority themes from the community survey

Sixty four themes were generated at the initial Oxley Community Planning Meeting. Surveys later distributed to all households asked residents to prioritise each theme from 1 to 5 (where 1 was 'not important' and 5 was 'very important'). Fifty three surveys were returned, representing over a third of the total number of households surveyed in Oxley. The results of the survey were compiled to obtain a 'priority score' and then a 'town ranking' for each theme, which has been listed below in a number of categories. These prioritised themes form the basis of the Oxley Community Plan.

Four projects have been completely finalised over the past three years since the finalisation of the 2012 Oxley Community Plan:

- Town ambience – Responsible pet ownership flyers distributed to residents in May 2014. No follow up visits by Council as promised. Raised with Enforcement Unit in January 2015 and follow up street visits likely to occur this year.
- Sewerage scheme – North East Water have completed the construction of the scheme in part of the Oxley town (roughly covering the designated half acre lots in the Township Zone). Residents have five years to connect to the scheme.
- Natural gas – The option of connecting natural gas to homes in Oxley was investigated in detail through meetings with Tim McCurdy, the State Government of Victoria and Rural City of Wangaratta. It is not viable to connect Oxley and Milawa for the small number of homes involved.
- Public facilities at Oxley Memorial Park – The park has been improved through funding received through a successful grant application and other sources. New shade sails and an undercover BBQ area were completed. The park is well used and is a great asset to our community.
