Oxley News

- Works at the Oxley Reserve continue with new tables in the pavilion for the public to use and weed spraying completed. Residents are invited to join the committee to look after the Reserve. - The doors at the Oxley Shire Hall have suffered weather damage over the years. The west side doors have been repaired but the front doors may need replacing. Options are being explored for financial assistance as the cost could be more than \$4000. Extending the heritage wire fencing along the western boundary is also a priority for the Hall Committee of Management.
- The High Tea in the Oxley Shire Hall in May raised \$1446, the Garage Sale raised \$1079.20 and the proceeds from

the Progressive Dinner on June 22 all went towards the Relay for Life team fundraising. Please support our Relay for Life fundraisers which will be advertised in **Whats On** in future newsletters.

2013 Community Projects

Seven projects were selected from our Community Plan to focus our efforts on this year. The projects cover a variety of features for the town including environment, infrastructure, amenity, history and communication. They are briefly outlined below:

- Stan Allan Reserve In conjunction with Council, we are investigating options for formalising picnic/camping areas, improving road access and drainage. Champion – Janet Heath.
- More responsible pet ownership -Improving awareness of rights/responsibilities as defined in Councils bylaws. Champion – Sally Day.
- Stormwater drainage Encouraging Council to further investigate and improve stormwater drainage in key areas in town. Champion – ORA
- Street trees Compile lists of relevant species for planting, responsibilities for pruning, etc. Champion – Residents' Assoc.
- Town history Investigate options/ideas for a town history walk. Print additional historical photos for display in the Shire Hall and add relevant captions. Champion – Dianne Feldtmann and Neil Brock.
- 6. Noticeboard for Oxley Primary School Investigate feasibility of installation of a

noticeboard at the Memorial Park to advertise school functions, students work and other Oxley social functions, to further strengthen communication between the school and local residents. Champion – Bruce Uebergang.

 Community newsletter – Develop a community newsletter for disseminating social event information, progress on community projects and other relevant news to Oxley Residents. Champions – Alison Stephens and Sally Day.
