Oxley Residents' Assoc.

A brief update on the projects of the association:

- We are continuing to chase up the responsible land manager for the reserve with Council and DEPI. Our next step will be to develop a management plan in consultation with all the stakeholders.
- Council has informed us that they have engaged a contractor to connect the public toilets at the Oxley Memorial Park to sewerage system. This will reduce the wet and boggy areas around the playground over winter.
- The High Tea in May raised \$2000 for the Oxley Relay for Life team. 105 people attended and enjoyed some delicious food and great entertainment. Thanks to the Social Committee who make this such a wonderful annual event.
- The Remembrance Day Committee has received some information about grants available in relation to the Gallipoli Centenary. We are proposing recognising our Vietnam veterans on the remaining blank panel of the Memorial at the park.
- We are in the process of applying for a Grant to cover the cost of a laptop and colour printer/scanner to be shared amongst Oxley's community groups.

Oxley Fire Brigade News

- The community donated \$2600 via the brigade to Royal Children's Hospital Good Friday Appeal.
- The brigade has raised the fire hazard on north of Faithful Street through Wangaratta Group and Rural City of Wangaratta.
- Two new members have joined. The brigade now has about 40 members, but needs members who are available during business hours for day call outs.
- Elections were recently held. Tony Ciavarella has stepped down as Captain after 8 years, he thanked all for the support over the years. The new Captain is Wayne Doig, 1st LT Tony Ciavarella, 2nd LT Bruce Uebergang, 3rd LT Brendan McDonald, 4th LT Warwick Philpott. Oxley Shire Hall

Whilst we are gearing up for another Bush Market in November, we have also been busy at the Hall:

- Captions being added to existing historical photos around the hall and new photos are being framed.
- A building permit has been submitted to Council for a new shed to securely store our gazebos, umbrellas and dinner chairs as our existing shed has reached storage capacity.
- Council have engaged a contractor to connect the Hall to sewerage scheme in the near future.
- The hall piano is having a face-lift and will be stained, polished and tuned.
- The new front doors for the Hall have been built by Claytons Joinery and will be hung in the coming weeks. We need to investigate suitable locks for our new doors.

Oxley Recreational Reserve | Oxley Township

- The Committee is applying for a grant to upgrade the toilets, install air conditioning/ heating and a dump point for RV travellers.
- Thankyou to everyone who helped to complete the Reserve usage survey. We have the results from the surveys and these will be compiled to develop our Strategic Plan.
- The North East CMA has commenced removal of willow, blackberry and hawthorn along the river frontage. A riparian fence is being erected with a cattle grid allowing Reserve users access to the river. The frontage will be periodically grazed to reduce grass loads at appropriate times.

- You can also view a copy of one of Donald Sutherlands letters at the Historical Exhibition of Oxley and District, Monday 6 October at the Oxley Shire Hall from 2-4pm. Come along to see some wonderful black and white photos of your township and a copy of a recently found letter from Donald Sutherland and newspapers of the time, recounting his tale of the Kelly Gang and the Glenrowan siege. A local letter sure to excite all Kelly enthusiasts!
- We are in the process of developing a Town
 History walk. A number of sites of interest have
 been identified and drafted on a map. The next
 step will be to locate appropriate funding
 sources and consider types of site markers. Sites
 will also need to be prioritised once Milawa
 have compiled their points of interest.

The information is then sent directly to Councils Customer Action Request via email to be acknowledged and actioned by staff on the next working day.

- The year 5 and 6 super hero projects. The students investigated a wide range of super heroes and even invented their own super hero with magical powers.

 Over the course of 2 days students rode over 70km, stopping at Myrtleford Primary School for the night.
